JAY PARNELL









MEET ANITA FIELDS

Anita Fields is a potter who works with non-traditional clay to create abstracted images of traditional clothing and artifacts along with imagery intended to honor all women, particularly those of Indian descent. Anita was influenced by traditional Osage ribbon work, clothing, and blankets.

The personal and emotional elements in these textile designs led Anita to use them symbolically in clay, translating the personality of these vestments into her work. Anita says: "The dresses convey my attitudes toward the strength of women and how native peoples show remarkable resourcefulness and adaptability toward their environment. The clothing Indian women created shows great pride, dignity, and hope in a culture facing insurmountable odds."
