WE'RE GOING VIRTUAL UNTIL JANUARY 11TH!



During a visit to the Huashan 1914 Creative Park in Taipei in August 2016, a 12-year-old boy tripped and stumbled into a \$1.5 million Paolo Porpora painting. Midfall, the boy leaned into the painting (drink in hand) and punched a whole right through the canvas!

The boy, who was visiting the exhibition "The Face of Leonardo, Images of a Genius," punched a fist sized hole in the 350-year-old floral still life. To add insult to injury, this event was caught on the museum's security camera and went viral. After falling, the boy is seen looking around in horror at his mistake while people gather round him and the ruined painting.

Luckily for the boy and his family, the Huashan 1914 Creative Park doesn't have a "you break it, you own it" policy and the damage to the masterpiece was covered by insurance. Here's hoping the restoration went better than some of the other's we've seen!
