MEET JAMIE OKUMA

Jamie Okuma is a an Indigenous artist from the Luiseño and Shoshone-Bannock tribes. She is a fashion designer and uses many of the materials and techniques of the Luiseño and Shoshone-Bannock. As early as Okuma can remember her life has been in the art world in one way or another. Her mother Sandra was a graphic artist and worked at MCA records when Jamie was a child.

After high school Okuma took a few graphic design classes at Palomar collage in San Marcos, CA before attending the Institute of American Indian Arts in Santa Fe NM. From the age of 18 she has been a professional artist compleatly devoted to her art. Exhibiting her work at the Heard Indian Art Market in Phoenix AZ, and at the Santa Fe Indian Art Market.
